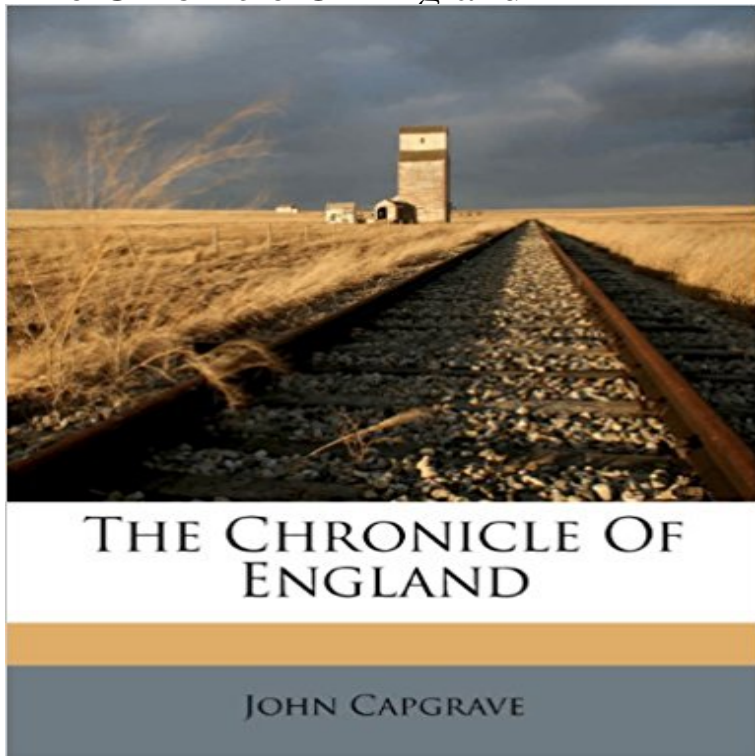


# The Chronicle Of England
