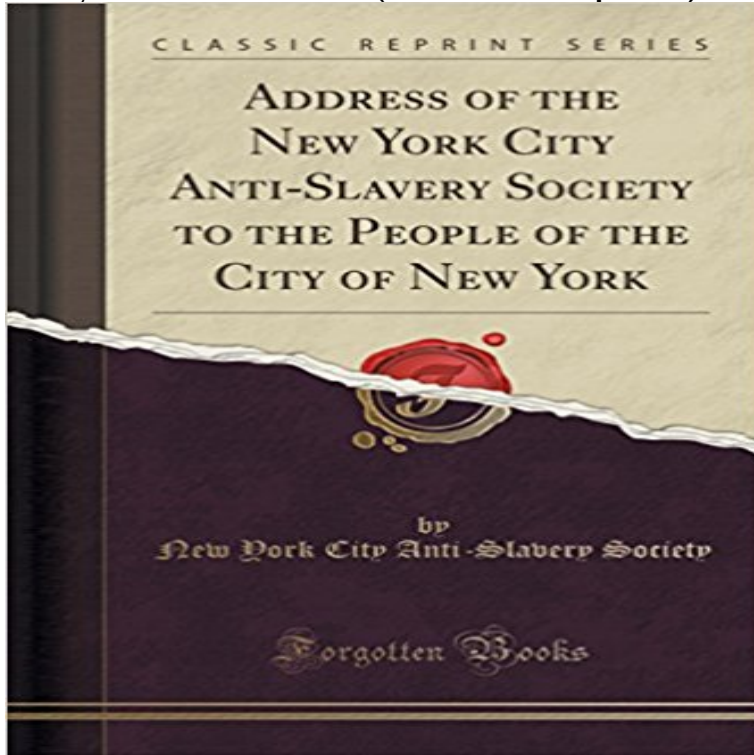

It is our object to recommend to them the only practicable and safe plan which has ever been proposed for the accomplishment of this great moral enterprise. It is that of Immediate Emancipation. By this term, we mean to say that all property of man in man should instantly cease; - that the right of all men to a fair recompense for their labor should be practically as well as theoretically admitted; and that all the people of these United States should be equally secured in the possession of the unalienable rights recognized in the Declaration of Independence, of life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. By the epithet immediate, we mean emphatically to mark our dissent from the project of gradual abolition - a plan that, on the testimony of Wilber-force and Clarkson, and the unanimous consent of the philanthropists of England, has been the virtual means of preventing the abolition of slavery in the British possessions, for nearly half a century; a plan which has, for almost sixty years, beguiled the free citizens of the United States, by soothing the public conscience with the hope of a wise and well digested measure of relief, while the number of the oppressed has already increased from half a million to two millions. We object, therefore, to the scheme of gradual emancipation, because it is too inefficient to arrest the mighty evil that threatens to destroy this nation.
