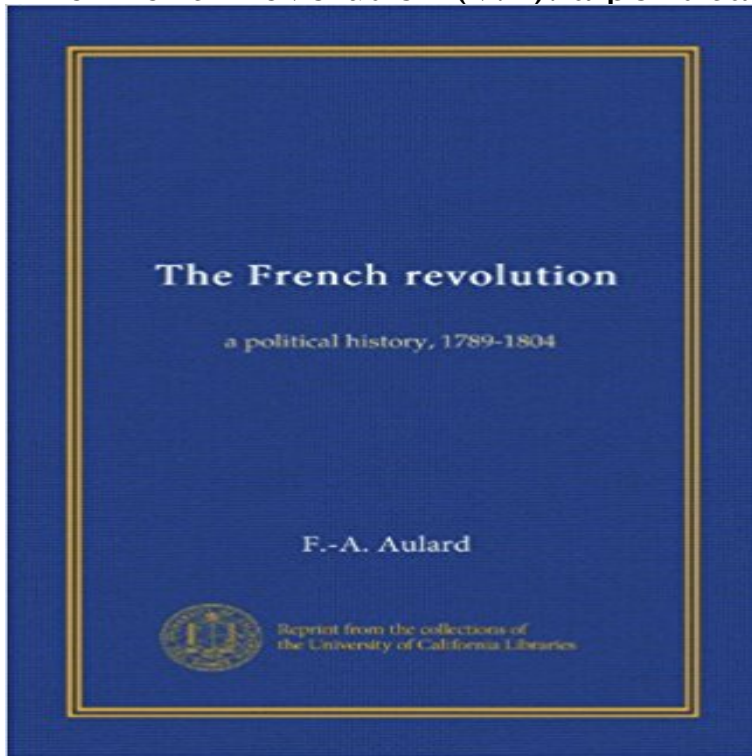


The French revolution (v.1): a political history, 1789-1804
