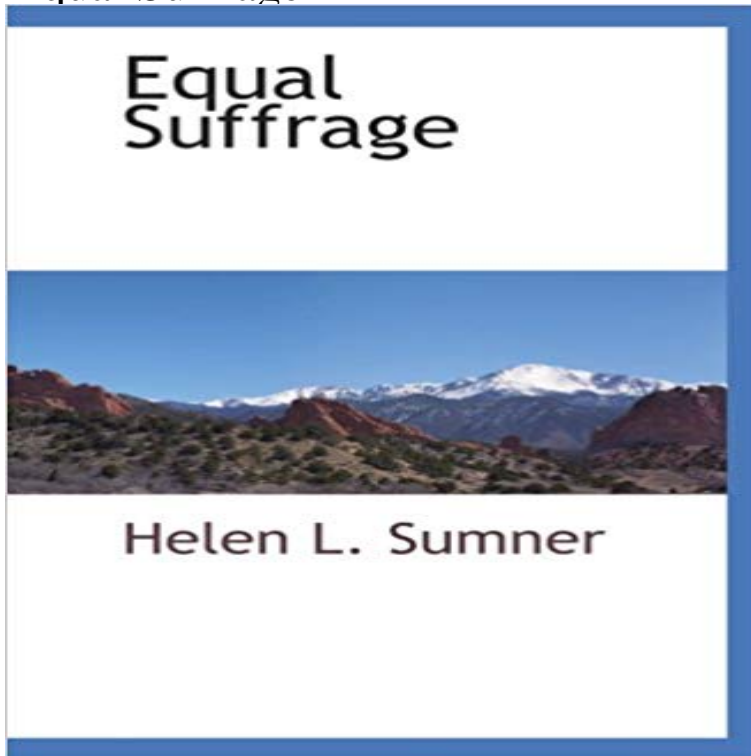


Equal Suffrage
