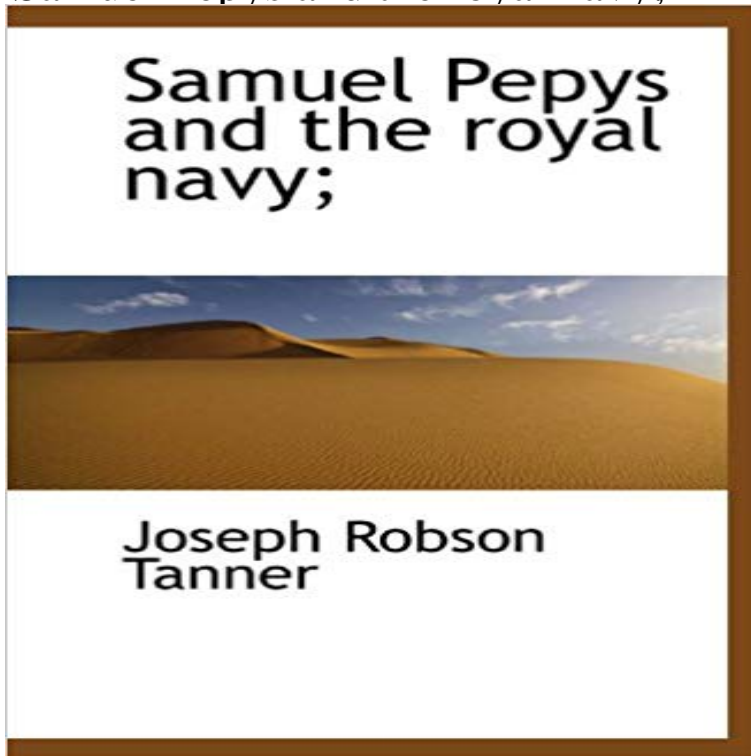


Samuel Pepys and the royal navy;
